



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

Brief presentation

Highlighting the social spirituality lived by Sr Rani Maria FCC (1954-1995), the thesis contains three chapters. The first chapter is a contextualized and chronological biography of Sr Rani Maria. Through a historical and descriptive analysis, a clear picture of her, as a loyal daughter of the Church and a patriot of India is brought out. The second chapter is the edition of her *collected writings and prayers*. The collections include: prayers, intentions for Holy Mass and adoration, decisions and convictions, meditation reviews, personal letters, social work reports, extracts of classes and other write-ups during the twenty years of her missionary life in North India, i.e., from 1976 to 1995. The third chapter, is specifically a hermeneutical analysis of the *writings and prayers* edited in the second chapter. The research aims at a more realistic study of her social spirituality through the edition of her collected writings.

⁴ Fr Palacken is Fr Joseph J Palackal [Many people use that form in conversation when they refer to him as a third person. It may be a Kerala custom to substitute the 'l' for more convenient 'n' but only for males]. Fr Joseph J Palackal is a CMI priest, member of the Sacred Heart Province, Kochi, Kerala. Fr Palackal received his priestly ordination in 1979 from Bp Gratian Mundadan CMI. He is a performing artist of Christian devotional songs in four languages: Malayalam, English, Sanskrit and Aramaic and he is the founder of the Christian Musicological Society of India. He met Sr Rani Maria for the first time in May 1977 in Bijnor when six musically-talented seminarians of Dharmaram College, Bangalore, formed a band and decided to make a music tour in the newly formed Eparchy of Bijnor. Sr Rani Maria was a member of St Mary's Convent, Bijnor at that time. She and Sr Mariusha FCC made the local arrangements for these programs. Quoting from fresh memories of Fr Palackal: "Sr. Rani Maria was delighted to introduce us to the following villages, where she was doing her social apostolate: Timarpur, Adampur, Ittawa, Pedda, and Kachpura. We travelled to these places on horse carts. Sr. Mariusha, a Hindi teacher, served as our translator. As per the Sr Rani Maria's suggestion, we designed a program of patriotic songs, popular films songs, and Christian bhajans. We named our band 'Singing Brothers'''. Fr JOSEPH J.
